Regulations:

1. **The Nomination form must be signed** by two (2) CUFA members and by the nominee. All signatories must be members in good standing, i.e., must have a current, valid CUFA membership form on file at the CUFA Office. If any of these criteria are not met, the nomination is not valid.
2. **Statement.** Candidates must provide a **brief position statement not exceeding 200 words** to be posted to the CUFA website throughout the election period and included on the ballot. This position statement should outline **nominees' qualifications** for serving on the CUFA Executive and **must address the questions above** on the challenges facing CUFA. Optionally, you may include a photo and/or a link to your personal or university web page.
3. **Submission.** Duly signed nomination forms and position statements, including candidates' qualifications and answers to the above questions, must reach the CUFA Office located at HB 109, Loyola Campus, **before 4:00 P.M. on Wednesday, April 1, 2015.** Nominations may be delivered by hand or sent by fax (514.848.3997) or e-mail to Chantal Bohbot (c.bohbot@concordia.ca).

A nomination is not complete until both the form and the statement are received. Valid nominations and accompanying position statements will be posted on www.cufa.net as received.
