Since starting at Concordia in 2005, I have served on CUFA council and CUFA's EDI committee, Concordia's IT Standards Committee, and co-directed two research centres. (My <u>profile</u> lists all my service.)

As CUFA executive member at large, I will lend my extensive research and administrative experience to the protection of all CUFA members' rights in this time of austerity. The issues I will focus on include:

- > increasing members' salaries to compensate for the inadequate coverage in the new health benefits plan; cooperation with other unions to prevent further erosion of benefits.
- > ensuring **adequate compensation for our increased workload** due to Unity, larger classes, and large laboratories.
- > protecting the digital rights of members to: control their computers; download and use research software; access Unity records on their grants; and prevent surveillance by software such as Glean.
- > proactive contract renegotiation strategies, such as getting a strike mandate before entering negotiations.
- > academic freedom for faculty and respect for dissident voices among students.
- > transparency and accountability in CUFA governance: the Executive must honour resolutions passed at the General Meeting and consult the Council before adopting political positions on behalf of all CUFA members at Concordia and at CAUT.
