Regulations:

- 1. The Nomination form must be completed by the nominee and supported by two (2) CUFA members (a nominator and seconder) The nominee must attach to the nomination form, an email from the nominator and seconder, confirming the nomination. The nominee, nominator and seconder must be members in good standing, i.e., must have a current, valid CUFA membership form on file at the CUFA Office. If any of these criteria are not met, the nomination is not valid.
- 2. **Statement.** Candidates must provide a **brief position statement not exceeding 200 words** to be posted to the CUFA website throughout the election period and included on the ballot. This position statement should outline **nominees' qualifications** for serving on the CUFA Executive and **must address the questions above** on the challenges facing CUFA. Optionally, you may include a photo and/or a link to your personal or university web page.
- 3. **Submission.** Duly completed nomination forms and position statements, including candidates' qualifications and answers to the above questions, and email confirmation from the nominator and seconder must reach the CUFA Office by email at c.bohbot@concordia.ca, **before 4:00 P.M. on Wednesday, April 7, 2021.**
- 4. A nomination is not complete until the nomination form and the statement are received, as well as the email confirmations from the nominator and seconder. Valid nominations and accompanying position statements will be posted on www.cufa.net as received.
