Regulations:

- 1. **The Nomination form must be signed** by two (2) CUFA members and by the nominee. All signatories must be members in good standing, i.e., must have a current, valid CUFA membership form on file at the CUFA Office. If any of these criteria are not met, the nomination is not valid.
- 2. Statement. Candidates must provide a brief position statement not exceeding 200 words to be posted to the CUFA website throughout the election period and included on the ballot. This position statement should outline nominees' qualifications for serving on the CUFA Executive and must address the questions above on the challenges facing CUFA. Optionally, you may include a photo and/or a link to your personal or university web page. Statements that are received as plain text will appear directly on the ballot. For statements that are received in PDF format, a link to the PDF file will appear on the ballot.
- 3. Submission. Duly signed nomination forms and position statements, including candidates' qualifications and answers to the above questions, must reach the CUFA Office located at HB 109, Loyola Campus, before 4:00 P.M. on Friday, March 31, 2017. Nominations may be delivered by hand or sent by fax (514.848.3997) or e-mail to Chantal Bohbot (c.bohbot@concordia.ca).

A nomination is not complete until both the form and the statement are received.
